LANGUAGE IN ROCKY HORROR PICTURE SHOW

Laverne Cox admits she had some concerns going into Fox's TV remake of The Rocky Horror Picture Show—specifically regarding her grand musical entrance as Dr. Frank-N-Furter, "Sweet Transvestite."

"I had a conversation [with director]
Kenny [Ortega]. We talked about the
word 'transvestite,' " the Emmy nominee
recalls. That term was once an acceptable
way to describe a transgender person
who had not completed their medical
transition; now, it is an, "...antiquated
term that trans folks certainly don't use
anymore."

So to be clear: "Historically, the terms have changed [and] it doesn't mean the same thing today that it meant in the 70s," she says. "It's not appropriate to refer to trans people as a transvestite [today], but it is [used here as] the character in that specific moment in history."
